
What are our Goals?

The Academic & Student Affairs Division serves as an information resource to the colleges in an effort for the state to remain competitive and on the cutting edge of program development.











ACADEMIC YEAR 2014 - 2015 PERCENT OF SYSTEM GRADUATES BY CLUSTER

2. Curriculum Approval


Curriculum approval and review is ongoing. In 2015, a total of 33 new certificates were approved, in addition to 98 courses, and four associate degrees.


3. Peer Groups


