








Degree-Seeking Fall Enrollment Trend by Registration Status






Data Highlights – Developmental Education



- Includes all students who took at least one remedial course during the academic year
- The percentage of students in developmental education has decreased by 41% across the five years
- AY 2017-2018 appears to have plateaued at 18% of students in developmental education

- SCTCS placement rates have been above 85% for the past 5 years

COURSE OFFERINGS

The *Basic Motorcycle Course* is a license waiver course for individuals who have never ridden a motorcycle, who are interested in learning basic skills, or who want to see if motorcycle riding is for them.

The *Intermediate Motorcycle Course* is a course designed for riders who have some experience and want to sharpen their skills.

The *Experienced Motorcycle Course* is for riders who want to hone their skills on their personal motorcycle.

The *Advanced Motorcycle Course* is a course with fundamental procedures for riding a sport bike; however, any motorcycle can be used for this class. Individuals will learn advanced techniques on how to properly operate a motorcycle.

Perkins IV - 2018

- Held spring Perkins workshop reviewing Perkins IV tenets with OCTAE and nontraditional programs on April 24th
- CodeIT 2.0 held on April 13th, focusing on nontraditional program and completion of females in IT
- Article on innovative uses of Perkins' funds published in *Techniques* October issue, featuring Piedmont Technical College, Spartanburg Community College, Technical College of the Lowcountry, and Denmark Technical College
- Reauthorized July 31, 2018

Institutional Research – 2018

- Dual Enrollment Research Project
 - Comparison of dual enrollment and non-dual enrollment students in the SCTCS – Academic Year 2011-2012
 - Nearly 50% of the dual enrollment students enrolled as first-time freshman or first-time transfer in the SCTCS
 - Nearly 50% of dual enrollment students earned a postsecondary credential within the SCTCS and/or transfer institution
 - Dual enrollment students are nearly twice as likely to complete within 150% normal completion time, likely to persist and/or be retained, likely to complete college, and/or likely to transfer to a 4 year institution than non-dual enrollment students

Institutional Research – 2018

- Persistence Research Project - Updated
 - Comprehensive study of student success across a 6 year period for all first-time freshman and transfer students – Cohort 2011
 - Nearly 60% of the cohort met student success criteria (i.e., completion, transfer, or still enrolled), which is comparable to cohort 2008
 - Approximately 44% of the cohort completed a program within the SCTCS or at a transfer institution
 - Of the non-completer group, 60% left the institution with less than 30 credit hours earned


