



Getting Real About Poverty in SC

- According to the US Census Bureau's 2017 data, the population of the state is 4,882,720. The total number of people living in poverty is 751,907.
- South Carolina ranks 42nd overall in people earning incomes below the poverty line. The percentage of people living in poverty is 15.4%.
- South Carolina ranks 45th overall in the rate of children living in poverty. Twenty-two percent of children in the state live in households in which the total income is below the poverty line.

Getting Real About Poverty in SC

- According to a report from the Food Research and Action Center, 18.3 % of South Carolinians experienced food insecurity in 2017. South Carolina is ranked the 7th worst state in the United States in terms of residents who experience food insecurity.
- According to the Food Research and Action Center, children in South Carolina experience food insecurity at a rate of 19.9%. This statistic is higher than the national average of 17.9%.

I am able to manage my finances without having to work more hours




