

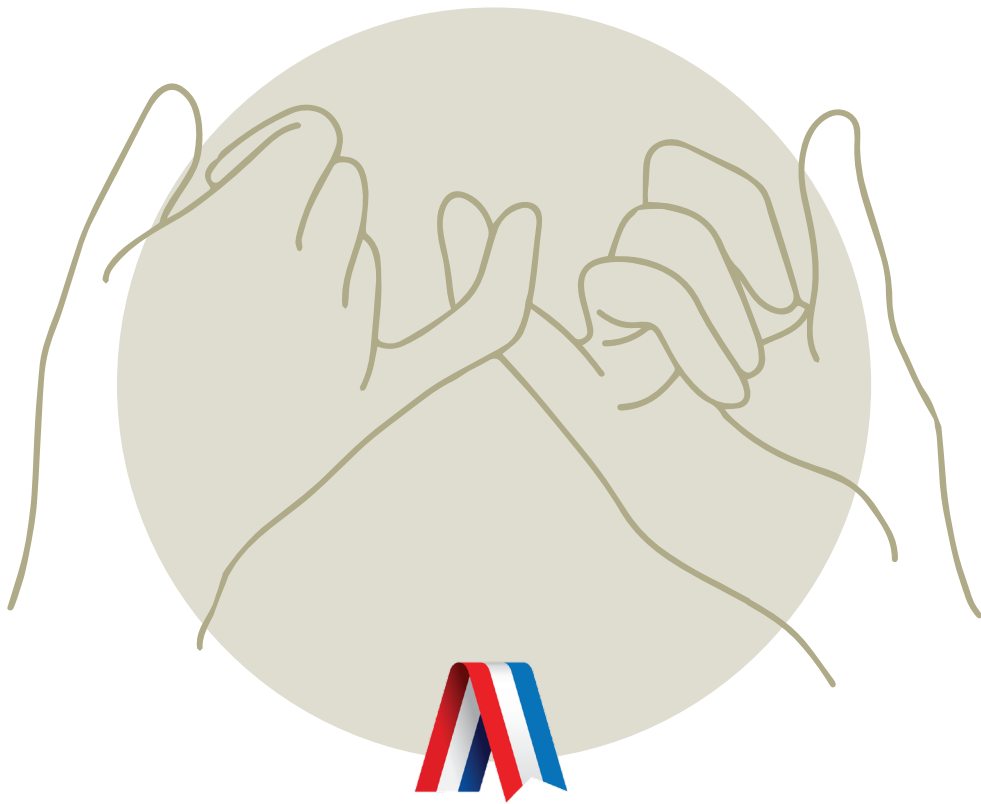
Designed to keep young people in school through graduation and improve the rate of success leading to self-sustaining outcomes.

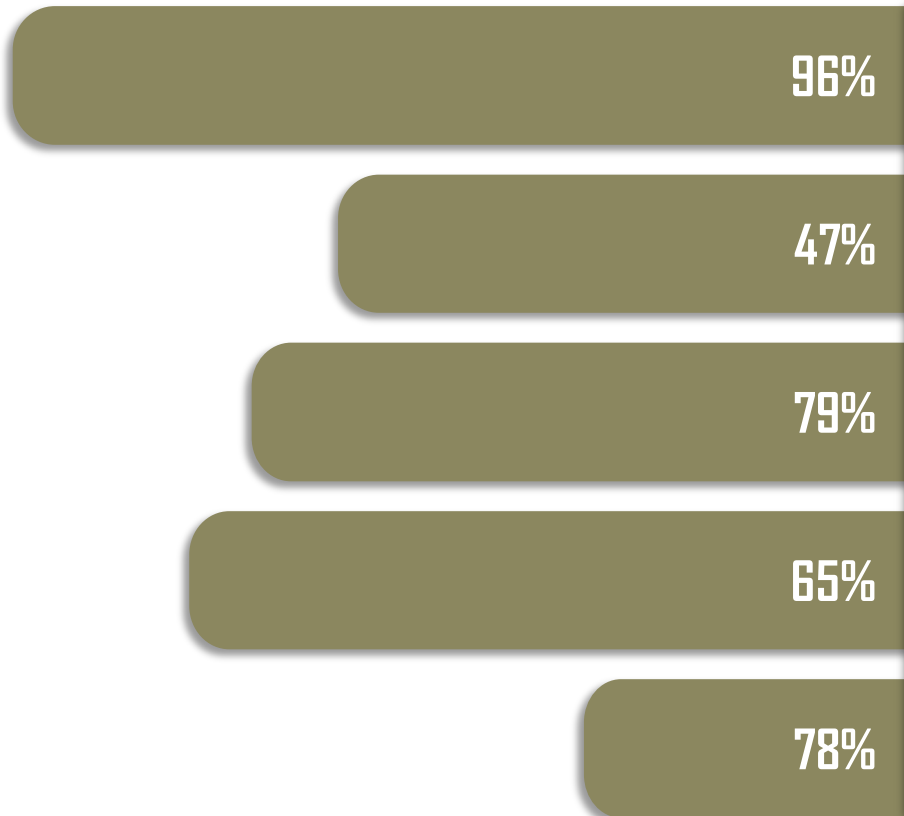

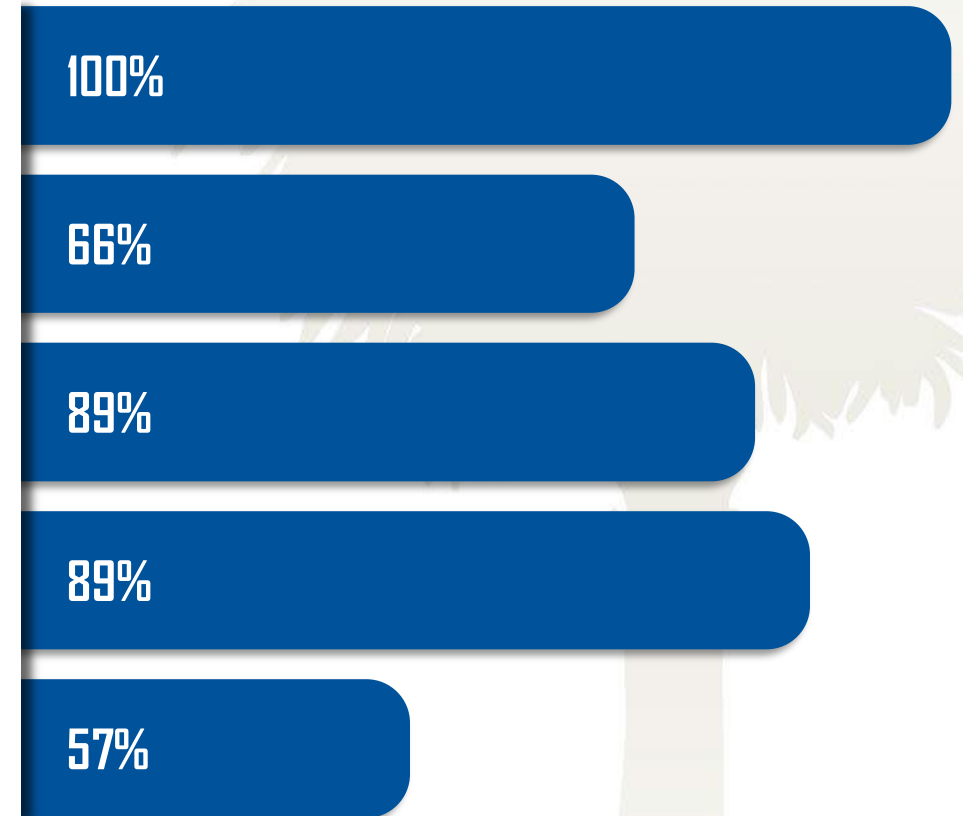

JAG PROGRAMS IN SOUTH CAROLINA



33 HIGH SCHOOLS

Currently implemented in 32 traditional high schools and 1 virtual school across the state



35-60 STUDENTS

A dedicated specialist works with 35-60 students identified by schools as facing significant life challenges (average of 7)



1-4 YEARS

Students may enroll in JAG for 1-4 years as an elective, receiving one Carnegie Unit of credit for each year of participation



37 CORE COMPETENCIES

Students master 37 Core Competencies. They may master up to 87 with multiple years of enrollment.



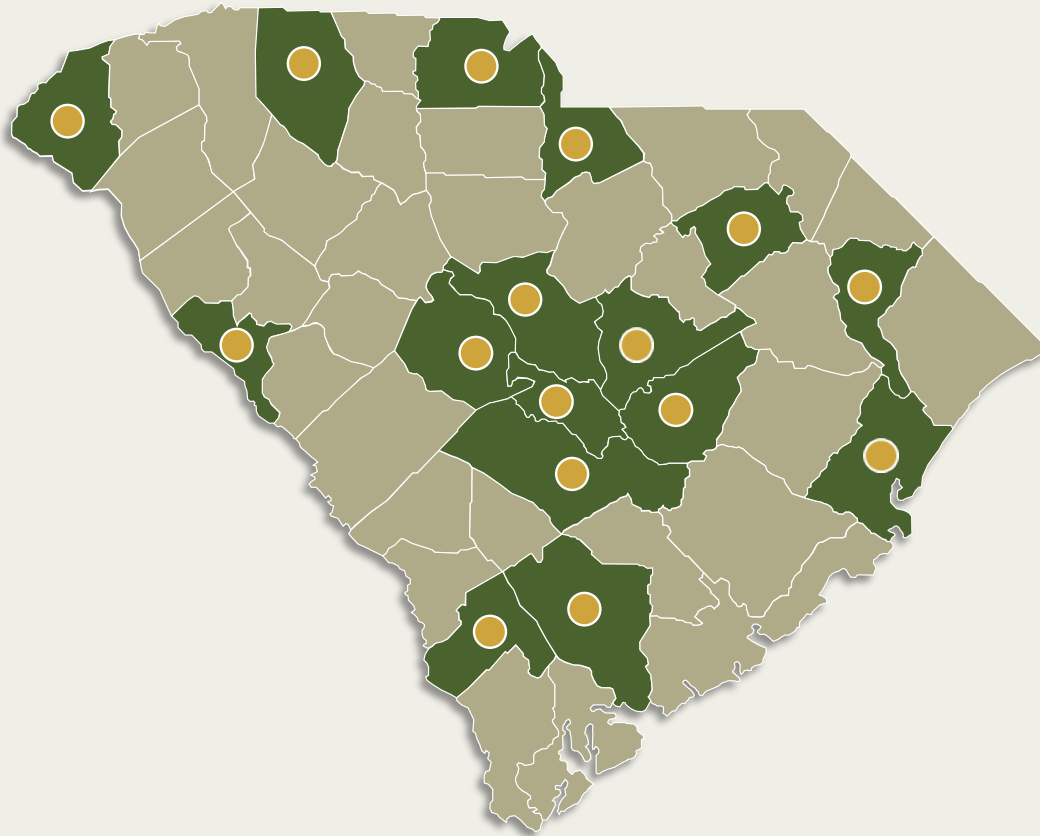
1 YEAR FOLLOW-UP
