College enrollment is down due to the coronavirus pandemic but the Latino student population has been hit particularly hard.

Spring 2021 undergraduate enrollment is down 5.9 percent from last year, according to the National Student Clearinghouse. Latino enrollment, which had been rising before the pandemic, showed some of the biggest swings: A decrease of 1.9 percent in spring 2021 compared to an increase of 2.1 percent in spring 2020. Community colleges, which include large Latino student populations, saw a 13.7 percent decrease in enrollment in spring 2021, compared to an increase of 1.7 percent in spring 2020.

Students dropped out for are a variety of reasons: Family members became sick or lost their jobs and the student had to help support the family. Or, they just couldn't afford it anymore. And, instead of falling further behind, they decided to drop out. Source:

### 2020 Census shows growing number of Hispanic and multiracial residents in Spartanburg County

Spartanburg County's <u>population growth</u> came with an increase in racial and ethnic diversity, particularly around Spartanburg city and surrounding towns, according to data from the 2020 Census.

The U.S. Census Bureau data released on Aug. 12 indicated from 2010 to 2020 Spartanburg's overall population increased by 15.3%. While the county's non-Hispanic white population grew by 6.7%, the Hispanic population grew by 66.4%. The Black population grew by 9.7%, and the Asian population grew by 44.4%. The population of Spartanburg County residents that identify as multiracial grew by 311.0% from 4,755 to 19,542.

Hispanic students in SC reflect astounding diversity in terms of culture, language, and national origin. Many in the state are long-term residents whose families have lived here for decades—if not generations—while others are relative newcomers. This richness of identity, history, and belonging is perhaps most salient in the state's schools, colleges, and universities. Drawing on Roth's research and Eisner's reporting for *The State* and *The Island Packet*, this presentation provides a snapshot of South Carolina's Hispanic students and the challenges they face to accessing resources, information, and support in the schools they attend. Ultimately, we point to the important role of families, communities, schools, and policy to ensuring that Hispanic children and youth in South Carolina are valued for who they are today and who they will be tomorrow: the state's professionals, business owners, community leaders, and elected officials.
