



DATA HIGHLIGHTS - REGISTRATION STATUS






DATA HIGHLIGHTS - RACE/ETHNICITY AND GENDER










DATA HIGHLIGHTS - PLACEMENT RATES

A statewide technical college scholarship program designed to address workforce shortages in South Carolina. It supplements Lottery Tuition Assistance to help cover any tuition and mandatory fees left after applying all other scholarships or grants.



Must be receiving LTA for the current academic year and majoring in a critical workforce area

OR


Must be receiving LTA for the current academic year and meet the USDA income eligibility guidelines for free and reduced-priced meals.



During the Spring 2020 semester, recipients receive \$100 per credit hour up to \$2500 annually after applying all other scholarships or grants. The scholarship may cover the cost of tuition and mandatory fees. There is also a book allowance of up to \$300 per year if a student qualifies through the critical workforce area criteria.







FEDERAL POLICY RELATED UPDATES

State Authorization

- Final federal regulations regarding state authorization were released Nov. 2019 with a July 1, 2020 implementation date
- Institutions must choose whether to continue abiding by 2016 state authorization rule and transitioning to new rule by July 1, 2020 OR immediately comply with the new regulation

Accreditation

- Final federal regulations regarding accreditation were also released Nov. 2019 with a July 1, 2020 implementation date
- The new rule removes the distinction between national and regional accreditation; allows accreditors to more quickly approve institutional changes
- The final regulation also allows accreditors to consider subject matter expertise in lieu
 of academic preparation for dual enrollment faculty approval



FEDERAL POLICY RELATED UPDATES

Title IX

- Draft regulations released November 2018
- Over 124,000 comments received during two-month public comment period
- Final regulations expected Spring 2020???



COMPLIANCE


- Revisions to SCBTE 3-2-106.2: Procedures for Addressing Allegations of Sexual Violence & Sexual Harassment did not move forward due to lack of final federal Title IX regulations.
- Assisted with revisions to Student Code and Student Grievance Procedures
- Web Accessibility Technical Assistance and SC Department of Education Web Accessibility Training were offered in 2019
- Developing compliance frameworks for various division areas
